

PHILOSOPHY OF LOVE AND SPIRITUAL PERFECTION IN THE POETRY OF JALALUDDIN RUMI

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Abstract

One of the most well-known Sufi writers, Jalaluddin Rumi's works intensely probe the ideas of love and spiritual perfection. His poetry offers a philosophical and metaphysical viewpoint on human life and heavenly connection going beyond basic literary representation.
