Johnson and Birkeland (2003) state that lack of recognition and respect sometimes negatively affects a teacher's morale and job satisfaction. This usually occurs thanks to social stereotypes and misconceptions about the teaching profession, argues Lortie (2002). Low salaries and financial issues can sometimes prevent students from opting for the teaching profession. In many countries, teaching is often an underpaid job compared to others. Despite their critical role in both society and an individual's life, they are provided with limited financial rewards, which can lead to financial stress and dissatisfaction. According to Hanushek et al. (2019), low teachers' salaries are one of the main reasons for job dissatisfaction and high turnover rates in the field of teaching. Sometimes teachers should deal with their students' behavior, discipline, and usually students parents' expectations, which can be mentally burdensome sometimes. Roeser et al. (2013) found that teachers frequently experience emotional distress and anxiety due to the pressure of handling such kinds of situations. While research conducted by Skaalvik (2017) shows that excessive workload and lack of support from school management contribute to high levels of stress and burnout among teachers. Notable, too, is the fact that in many education systems, teachers are allowed to fix the curriculum and prepare students for standardized tests, which could limit their creativity and flexibility during classroom lessons. Darling-Hammond (2017) highlighted that standardized testing pressure negatively affects teacher's autonomy and job satisfaction. Another compelling minus of teaching is that sometimes teachers face limited opportunities for career advancement. Most teachers keep stable for years without any promotion or salary increments – lead to frustration and demotivation. Guarino et al. (2006) stated that limited career progression is one of the main reasons why many talented teachers leave the profession for other careers.

Methodology




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The method of this article is survey which conducted with a total of 39 respondents and included multiple-choice and multi-selection questions in order to explore various aspects of career motivation, challenges, and societal perceptions of teaching. The selection criteria focused on students who are currently making career decisions. A structured Google Forms survey was examined online to collect responses. The questionnaire consisted of mostly multiple-choice questions. Participation in the survey was voluntary, responses were anonymity.

Findings and discussion

Interesting in teaching as a career: Participants were asked whether they had ever considered becoming teacher. The responses revealed that a significant portion of the participants had chose the profession, while smaller percentage were either unsure or had ever thought about it. Motivations for choosing teaching: participants were allowed to select multiple reasons for considering a teaching career. Common motivations included a passion for teaching, a desire to help others, job stability, long holidays, and the influence of teaching on society.





Also, many students prefer teaching because they have desire to help others which almost responsible for 18%. Long holidays (15%) motivate some teachers. The factor Influence on society was chosen by 20% of respondents which may suggest many individuals view teaching as a way to contribute positively to society.

Challenges faced by teachers: The survey also explored challenges teachers encounter. Among the most frequently cited issues were high workload and stress, low salaries, emotional pressure, limited career growth, and lack of respect from society.




As chart representing high workload and stress and low salary emerge as the top challenges for students 33.3%, and 30% respectively. That indicates many teachers may feel overworked and underpaid. Emotional pressure is another major concern (18%), lack of respect



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from society is a noticeable challenge claiming idea that while teachers have great impact on society, they may not receive the respect they deserve.

Reasons for avoiding a teaching career: emphasizing why students may avoid teaching is vital for addressing challenges in the field of education. The survey identified key deterrents, such as low salaries, high responsibilities, stressful working environments, and lack of appreciation. These factors about financial security and work-life balance may deter potential educators while teaching is viewed as rewarding profession




Low salary is the most significant factor for avoiding teaching (43%) which indicates financial concerns are a major deterrent for teachers. Stressful environment is another major reason (32%), lack of appreciation and high responsibility are notable concerns with respective figures of 12%, 10% highlighting that many people feel that teachers do not receive enough recognition for their efforts.

Teachers role in shaping society: important part of survey identified whether respondents believe teachers play essential role in shaping society. Over 90% of participants agreed that teachers significantly impact the younger generation and contribute to national development. Only small percentage disagreed.
